Some of the instruments we will be exploring include, xylophones, percussion, recorders, ukuleles and boomwhackers, just to name a few. During the term we will have performance opportunities, both to watch and to participate in as well as a drumming workshop (still to be determined). Cost:\$0

( This requires full equipment)

### Description of Gr. 7 Programs

#### **Musical Theatre:**

The mission of the Musical Theatre Program at OLA is to provide students exposure to a variety of disciplines in a Catholic environment where we focus on developing our gifts from God: creativity, ingenuity, empathy, leadership and innovation. This program is based around the fine arts; drama, music, visual arts and dance. Students will also have the opportunity to acquire skills and techniques in media and set design. Students will have the opportunity to build community partnerships and to work with experts in various fields. Cost will cover the following: theatre performances, workshops, field trips, apparel, transportation, all materials needed for performances, and a whole program retreat. Cost: \$450

**Sport 4 Life:** Take your participation in physical activities to the next level! Students are exposed to a variety of challenging athletic activities using expert instructors and community facilities. From October through March there will be on-ice component every week. ( This requires full equipment)

Activities may include: hockey, yoga, cross training, tennis, golf, skiing, soccer, rugby, fencing, scuba, triathlon, water polo, cycling, wall climbing, zip lining,

Leadership Opportunities: plan and organize a school event: Saint John XXIII Field Day, OLA Grade 7

Triathlon. Cost Includes: clothing, transportation, field trips, rentals, instructors, and course materials.

Cost: \$1090

**L.E.A.P. Program (Lead, Explore, Apply, Perform) :** In this student centered program, participants will have the opportunity to explore and develop projects of personal interest. Helping students build compassion and empathy in their daily life while exploring various technologies foundational within the program. Projects that students work on will integrate leadership skills and apply technology as students work to realize the power that they have to make the world a better place. Within the program, students could explore robotics, coding, video and photo editing, web design and video game creation. The creation and implementation of a school wide video blog where students use video technology to empower the OLA school community is just one example of a project students in the L.E.A.P. could explore. Cost: \$0

### Description of Gr.7 Options

**French 7:** In *French 7* students will continue and further expand their *French* experiences from *French 6*. Numerous hands on activities, partner and group projects peak interest in students and everyone is encouraged and supported in this language learning process. *French* is a fun, interactive and creative option where students learn the value and diversity of our *French* culture in Canada and throughout the world. Both *French 7 and 8* students will be involved in organizing the *French "Winter Carnival"*. *French 7* will focus on the following 4 themes: 1)My School 2) Weather/clothing 3)People around Me 4) Various holidays and celebrations Cost: \$0

**Fabulous Foods 7:** For the 2016 - 2017 school year, Foods 7 will be an introductory foods course and the students will learn about foods and nutrition while cooking. Students will learn and practice safe and sanitary food handling and safe use of equipment throughout the lab portion of this class. Students will learn how to select, prepare and serve foods. In addition, students will learn equipment terms, organizational skills, the function of ingredients and how to evaluate their products. Student best behaviour is required to ensure safety in the lab. Students need to learn teamwork skills, proper cleaning skills and must be willing to taste all food products. If you are willing to try new foods... this is the cooking class for you! Cost: \$40

**Art 7:** In grade 7 Art, students have an opportunity to explore a variety of 2 dimensional art such as pencil drawing techniques, oil and chalk pastel, watercolor, tempera, and acrylic paints. Students also create a variety of 3 dimensional sculpture using materials such as wire, cardboard, clay, plaster, and foam. Students will enjoy experimenting with shading, colour blending, perspective drawing, in abstract and realistic styles. Cost:\$25

**Design Studies 7:** In Design Studies, students will be expected to solve visual problems, structural problems and organizational problems using the context of their environment, their other classes and their community experiences. This ability to solve problems will be applied by Design Studies students to various projects throughout the term, making them aware of design in their environment, engaging them in designing, and showing them how design processes may be used in many contexts. Design Studies focuses on the following major areas: creativity and aesthetics (efficiency), processes (design, construction), resources (planning, management), and communication. Cost: \$0

**Personal Wellness 7:** Students will explore concepts related to his/her total health and wellness. Through classroom and practical (physical activity) lessons students explore the following topics: the 11 parts of physical fitness, practice/training planning, performance enhancing drugs (intro) and sport culture. Cost: \$0

**Drama 7: “Hear Ye, Hear Ye!”** In Drama, students will be using their head, voice, facial expressions and body movement to convey meaning, entertain and generally have fun. At the grade 7 level students are introduced to drama through six main areas of study: movement, speech, improvisation, acting, theatre studies and technical theatre, as per the Alberta program of studies. This is a participation based class where students gain self-confidence, foster group interaction and imaginative exploration. Note: grade 6 Drama is **not** a prerequisite. Cost: \$0

**Outdoor Education 7 (Being one with Nature):** In Outdoor Ed 7, students are given the opportunity to learn about the environment around them and how to enjoy the outdoors in a respectful and responsible manner as a group and individual. Students will learn what it takes to plan, implement and assess outdoor excursions such as a camping trip. They will incorporate trip planning, menu planning, basic knot and compass skills along with basic camping equipment utilization and maintenance. This is done in a setting where individual and group problem solving are developed and fostered. The course fee covers course materials and equipment. Cost: \$50

**School of Rock 7:** In this option students will explore the exciting world of rock music. Depending on their skill level, students will first learn basic guitar chords and strumming patterns, and will then work on learning popular songs. The goal will be to play and perform these songs in small groups. The focus of this class is to develop within the student an appreciation of music in general, and specifically of rock music. Acoustic guitars are provided if needed at no cost. Students are encouraged to bring in their own electric or acoustic guitars, or other instruments, if desired. Cost: \$0

**Film Studies 7:** In this option students critically analyze film from a number of perspectives: narrative, technical, performance, and creative. Activities will include discussion, film viewing, creating a stop motion animation and a movie trailer. Cost: \$0

**App Savvy 7:** For the 2017-2018 school year, students will be exploring new and emerging technologies happening in the world around them. The course will follow the CTF model which is project based and student driven using the idea of a MakerSpace!. Possible avenues of direction could include coding, robotics, video editing, animation and even video game design. Students will be exposed to a variety of different emerging technologies that could allow them the opportunity to implement these skills in different facets of their everyday life journey. Come and join the Maker Movement! Cost: \$0

Projects that students work on will integrate leadership skills and apply technology as students work to realize the power that they have to make the world a better place. Within the program, students could explore robotics, coding, video and photo editing, web design and video game creation. ### Description of Gr. 8 Options

**French 8:** In *French 8* students will continue and further expand their *French* experiences from *French 7*. Students will be pursuing abilities in their listening and reading comprehension as well as in oral and written production. Numerous hands on activities, partner and group projects peak interest in students and everyone is encouraged and supported in this language learning process. *French* is a fun, interactive and creative option where students learn the value and diversity of our *French* culture in Canada and throughout the world. Both *French 7 and 8* students will be involved in organizing the *French* “Winter Carnival”. In addition, a field trip to “The Crêperie” restaurant will be planned for *French 8 students*. *French 8* will focus on the following 4 themes: 1)Animals 2) Clothing 3)Food 4) Various holidays and celebrations Cost: \$0

**First Class Foods 8:** For the 2016 - 2017 school year, Foods 8 will be an second level foods course and the students will learn further skills about foods and nutrition. Students will review and practice safe and sanitary food handling and safe use of equipment throughout the lab portion of this class. Students will learn how to select, prepare and serve foods. Student best behaviour is required to ensure safety in the lab. Students need to

demonstrate effective teamwork skills, proper cleaning techniques and must be willing to taste all food products. The recipes and projects at this level increase in complexity into the Foods 8 course. This foods class will lead into Grade 9 Foods class at JPII. Cost: \$40

**Art 8:** In grade 8 Art, students will enjoy exploring a variety of 2 dimensional art such as pencil drawing techniques, oil and chalk pastel, watercolor, tempera, and acrylic paints on canvas. Students will also create a variety of 3 dimensional sculpture using materials such as wire, plaster, and a real favourite- Soapstone. Experimentation with shading, colour blending, perspective drawing, abstract and realistic styles and methods is encouraged. Cost: \$30

**Design Studies 8:** In Design Studies, students will be expected to solve visual problems, structural problems and organizational problems using the context of their environment, their other classes and their community experiences. This ability to solve problems will be applied by Design Studies students to various projects throughout the term, making them aware of design in their environment, engaging them in designing, and showing them how design processes may be used in many contexts. Design Studies focuses on the following major areas: creativity and aesthetics (efficiency), processes (design, construction), resources (planning, management), and communication. Cost: \$0

**Personal Wellness 8:** Students will explore concepts related to his/her total health and wellness. Through classroom and practical (physical activity) lessons students explore the following topics: body mass index, personal practice/training planning, performance enhancing drugs (steroid abuse), and sport culture. . Option Cost: \$0

**Drama 8: “Hear Ye, Hear Ye!”** In Drama, students will be using their head, voice, facial expressions and body movement to convey meaning, entertain and generally have fun. At the grade 8 level, students will expand their skills learned in previous years through six main areas of study: movement, speech, improvisation, acting, theatre studies and technical theatre, as per the Alberta program of studies. This is a participation based class where students gain self-confidence, foster group interaction and imaginative exploration. Note: grade 7 Drama is **not** a prerequisite. Cost: \$0

**Outdoor Education 8:** (Wilderness Survival 101) In Outdoor Ed. 8, students are introduced to skills that are vital when a camping trip goes wrong. Students will learn and practice bushcraft skills such as shelter building, fire starting, orienteering, wilderness first aid, and how to attain food and water from your environment throughout the course. This is done in a setting where individual and group problem solving are developed fostered. No matter which semester the student is enrolled in, they will have the opportunity to participate in the Camping trip which takes place in the first week of June. The course fee covers course materials, local field-trips, transportation and equipment maintenance. Course fee does not cover the cost of the camping trip. Cost: \$60 + Camping Trip Fee (TBD)

**School of Rock 8:** In this option, students will be introduced to the exciting world of rock music. Depending on their ability, students will begin by learning basic guitar chords and strumming patterns. From there, students will learn popular songs, eventually playing in small groups. The goal will be to perform for an audience. The focus of this option is to develop in the student an appreciation of music in general, and specifically of rock and popular music. Acoustic guitars are provided if needed, at no cost. Students are encouraged to bring in their own electric or acoustic guitars, or other instruments if desired. Cost: \$0

**Film Studies 8:** This course endeavors to critically analyze film from a number of perspectives: narrative, technical, performance, and creative. Activities will include discussion, film viewing, film creation, creating a sweded film and a culminating field trip to a movie theatre to see how it works. Option Cost: \$0
