## Classroom Updates:

## <u>ECS</u>

Had a great Halloween party. They have been in the outdoor classroom learning and having adventures.

#### Grade 1S

Getting ready for Christmas by decorating and learning how to read and write.

### Grade 1&2P

Working on our Charlotte's Web chapter book and activities. Working on computers to learn more about numbers.

### Grade 2SK/D

2SK/D finished their science unit on Small Crawling and Flying Animals. We explored how honeybees are beneficial to our environment and what they need to survive. Our next unit is Hot and Cold Temperature. We plan to work through a couple of experiments in this unit, to strengthen our understanding. In math, we are continuing to work on learning our numbers to 1000. We moved from working with a 100 chart to a 1000 chart!

This month we explored Remembrance Day activities and are finishing up our science unit on Small Crawling and Flying Animals as well and will be moving onto our next unit, Hot and Cold. In math we are continuing to work on numbers up to 1000 and learning the place value. We are currently working with Standard numbers and expanded form. In Social Studies, we are finished our Mapping unit and continuing to learn about Canada and our area by identifying our address, city and province. We are looking forward to learning about the upcoming season of Advent in Religion.

# Grade 3T

The Grade 3 class is continuing to showcase their building skills in science with towers and bridges. We are learning all about India and how our Canadian culture compares. Our main focus in Math right now is place value and numbers to 100 000.

## Grade 4C

We worked on a poppy art project for Remembrance day. We are getting t-shirts ordered for our leadership groups(faith, wellness and connection). We are beginning to plan what we can do as leaders in the school.

## Grade 3&4B

We enjoyed leading our school's Remembrance Day ceremony! All students were able to take part in some way, and truly felt honoured to do this. The Grade <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> class has begun a new unit on place value. Students are making connections from what they already know about place value to extend their understanding up to 100 000.
