Classroom Updates:

<u>ECS-</u> Kindergarten has been busy learning lots! We have spent February learning about love, friendship, and showing kindness to others. We have been working lots with our hands and bodies in our literacy/numeracy centres, as well as continuing to work on our letters/sounds of the week. We are looking forward to learning more about St. Patrick's day, Lent, and colours in the next few weeks!

<u>Grade 1S -</u> The Grade 1's had a blast with the Winter Arctic Games at the beginning of the month, they enjoyed spending time outside and learning new skills. We have had a focus of kindness this month. The Grade 1's enjoyed handing out Valentine's Day cards to their friends and celebrating 100 days of school. Our classroom won the Classroom of the Month award from Mix 107.9. It was a very special day for our class, they received pizza and a variety of prices! It filled our buckets!

<u>Grade 1&2P -</u> The grade 1s experimented with their 5 senses during our in school field trip with Hands on Science. The grade 2s had the opportunity to learn about and experiment with magnets in their Hands on Science program. Thank you to all of the parents who volunteered and made the opportunity possible!

<u>Grade 2SK/D -</u> We had a fantastic in-class field trip with Hands on Science. We learned so much about magnetism and are excited to use this information in our upcoming science unit. Thank you to our parent volunteers! Before we move onto Magnetism, we will be finishing up our Exploring Liquids unit. We are having fun predicting and observing results through the experiments we are conducting. In Math, we are working on 2 digit by 2 digit addition with and without regrouping.

<u>2TK-</u> Thank you to the Parent Council who donated their time to come cook pancakes and sausages for Shrove Tuesday for our school; 2TK LOVED them. We enjoyed a beautiful Mass in the gym with Father Tomacz for the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday. In Social, we are starting our new unit to learn about Iqaluit now that we have finished up with Meteghan. In Science, we had a fantastic in school field trip to learn about Magnetism with our other grade 2 friends. Thank you again for the parent volunteers who assisted. We are looking forward to learning about Liquids as well in science for this new unit we have started. In Math, we are also working on addition of 2 digit by 2 digit numbers with and without regrouping. In Language Arts,

we are continuing with Heggerty lessons and have been writing about our Lenten journey, as well as learning about plurals, homonyms, and editing sentences for grammar.

<u>Grade 3T-</u> We are wrapping up our Addition and subtraction unit in Math and are getting excited to multiply and divide. In Science we are investigating Rocks and Minerals and are planning a lab with pudding, graham crumbs and gummy worms to understand the layers of the Earth. We are almost done reading "Because of Winn-Dixie" and are looking forward to watching the movie in the gym next Thursday afternoon.

Grade 4C - We are wrapping up our Simple Machines unit in Science. The children have really enjoyed the experiments with this unit. Our next unit is Light and Shadows and an in-school T-Pet coming in March. In Social we are getting ready to present our tourism slide projects on the Regions of Alberta. We begin a new unit on the First People of Alberta. We had a fun-filled day of discovery at the Fort Heritage Precinct on Feb. 17 to kick off our learning. In Math, 4C has been working with telling-time and their multiplication and division strategies. In LA, 4C has recently written persuasive letters and are working on ways they can use punctuation, transition words and sentence variety to engage our audience. We are excited to start Fantastic Mr. Fox by Roald Dahl in our reading groups next week. The grade 4's really enjoy their weekly Friday morning time in the Chapel.

Grade 3&4B

As with 3T, we are wrapping up the addition and subtraction unit and getting ready to multiply and divide as well! We have begun our new novel study, "Stone Fox" and are already very interested in this exciting story! The students were so excited to choose a new book from our enhanced classroom library. Thank you School Council for supporting our classroom with \$150.00 towards new independent reading books! Every Friday we enjoy a STEAM activity where we bring together literacy, numeracy, and steam (science, technology, engineering, art, and math). In January we built catapults, animal shelters, snowflake poems, and chemical reactions. The students love their "Fun Friday's"!

"Notes" from the Music room:

The Edmonton Symphony Orchestra field trip was fantastic! We were able to sit very close to the orchestra and it enabled us to see so much. One student was so blown away by the first sounds of the orchestra playing together that he jumped and then came to ask me how they made "that sound". One student thought only 15 minutes had passed when it was time to leave (it was a 60min concert). They recognized the music we learned in class and heard Fur Elise played live. It was a successful field trip!

<u>Library/Learning Commons Update:</u> We are grateful to Mr. Walter Long for his generous cash donation to our Library Learning Commons - he seemed pleased when it was suggested that we use the funds to expand our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math) collections. Mr Long was the Junior High Science teacher at OLA for many, many years.

Thanks to the funds provided by the OLA School Council, and book rewards for hosting our book fair last fall, the Library Learning Commons will have over 200 new books on the shelf this month - with more the follow in March! Many thanks to Mrs. Van Ulden for her volunteer time, she has spend many hours helping prep the new materials for circulation.
